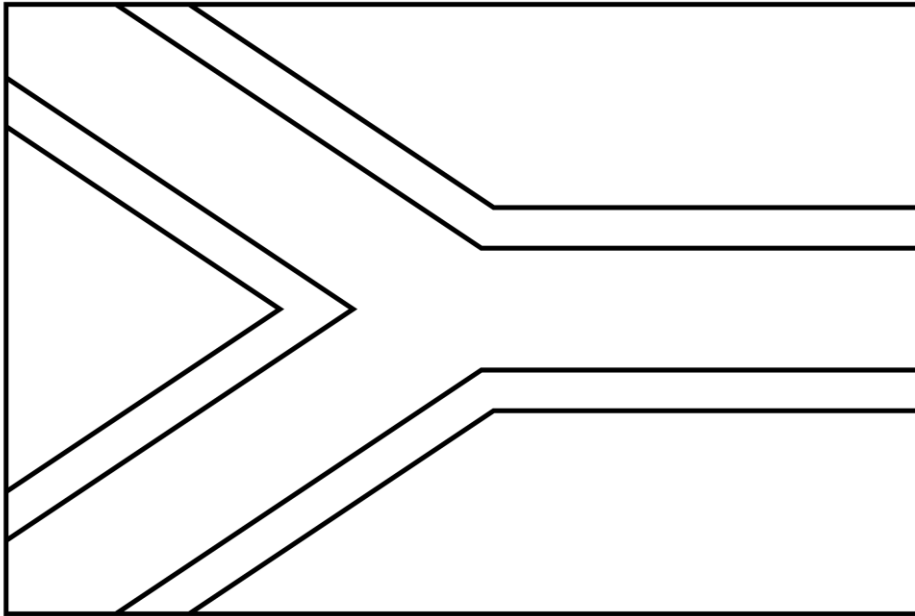

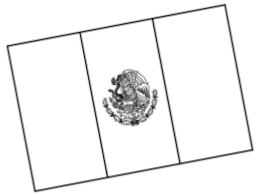

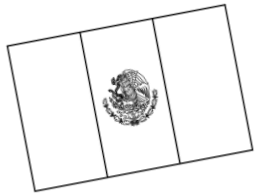
Pictures vary, but should include strings and a wooden "table-like" frame.

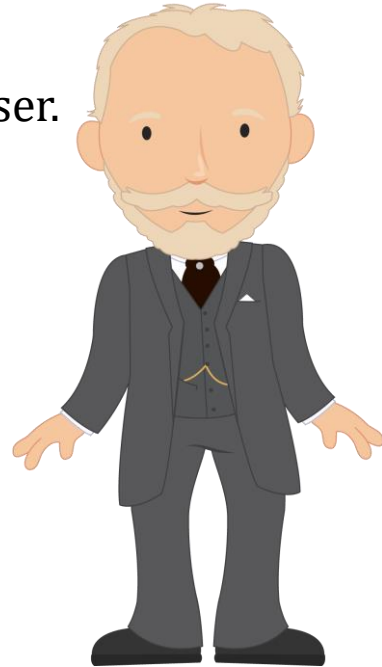
