How To Use Solfege Wars

There are currently three levels of Solfege Wars.

Beginner: The key is identified for singers. Emphasis is placed on recognizing stepwise motion, skips, and leaps.

Intermediate: Students must identify all 12 major key signatures. Emphasis is placed on understanding sharps and flats and finding "Do".

Advanced: Students must identify minor key signatures and accidentals within major/minor keys. Emphasis is placed on major/minor relationships and altered tones.

You may begin with whichever level meets the needs of your choir, but beginner level is recommended for ensembles with a large number of "non-readers".

Use the practice slides as a daily warmup and review. Allow students to test individual levels as they become ready. I let students work on their assessments during daily warmups Wed-Fri. A tracking sheet is provided for your convenience.




How To Beat the Level: Score 90% or higher on a level 1 assessment. In Level 1, all examples begin on "Do". Award: Advance to Level 2






How To Beat the Level: Score 80% or higher on a level 2 assessment. In Level 2, the starting pitch is identified for you.



Level Three

Finding Do in Flat Keys....

There are two strategies:

Find the Last Flat. Walk DOWN four steps (from Fa to Do).
 Find the Penultimate (2nd-to-last) Flat. This is Do.






